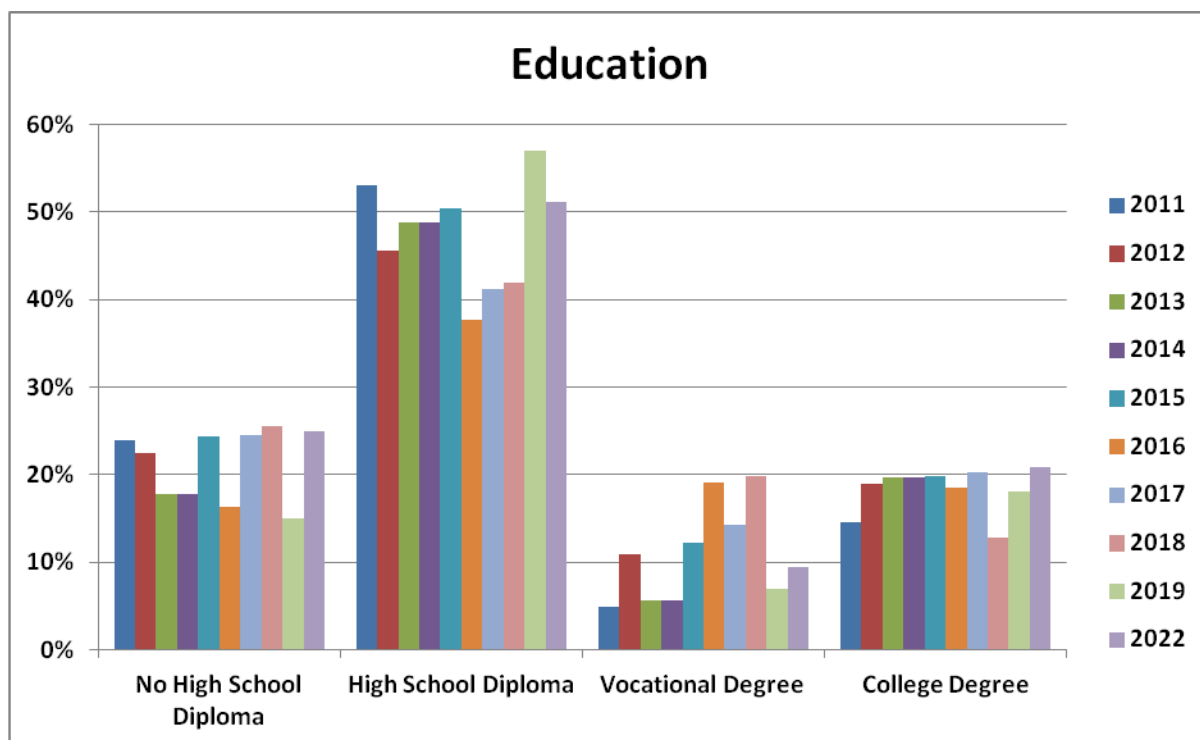
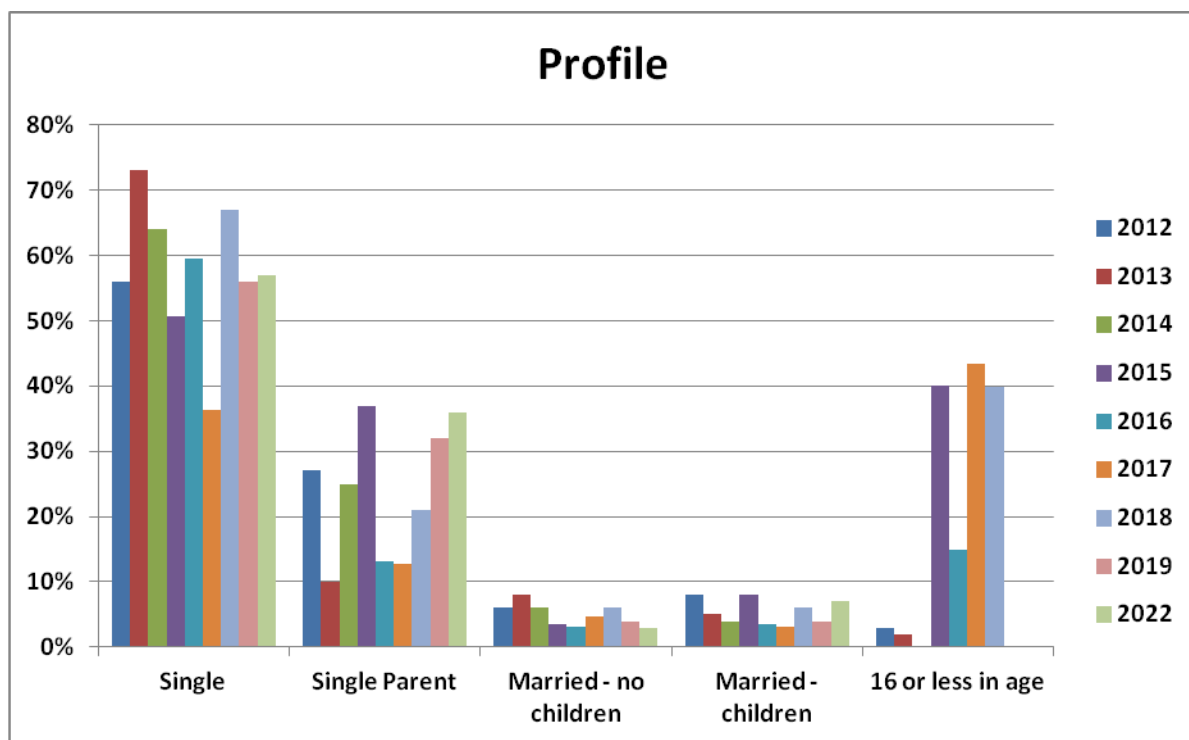

Annually ISOS holds a Day of Dignity Event for the homeless in Portland, Oregon. Islamic Relief USA sponsors the event with funds and some of the supplies. ISOS reaches out to the local agencies to participate at this event. This year, 2022, we are fortunate to have about 25 agencies/businesses providing resources to our homeless. We also provide survey on each homeless served. The number surveyed ranges from 500-600. We find children typically do not attend the event, parents in fear of their children being taken away by authorities. The event is held in the downtown area of Portland, where we find a high concentration of homeless.

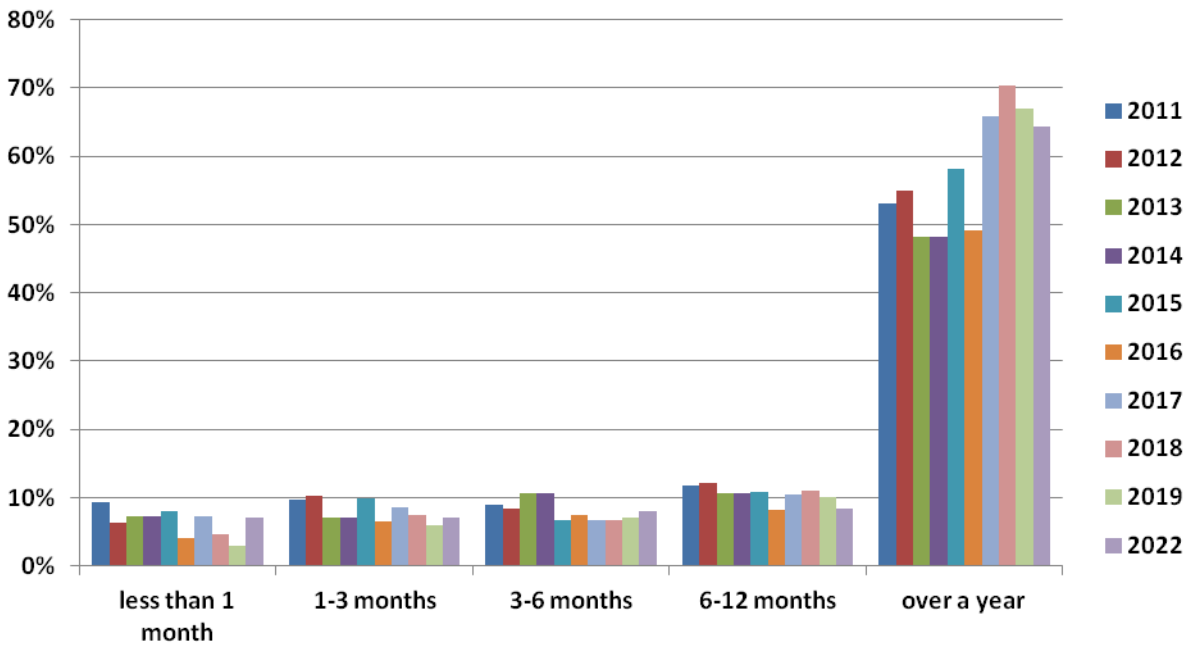

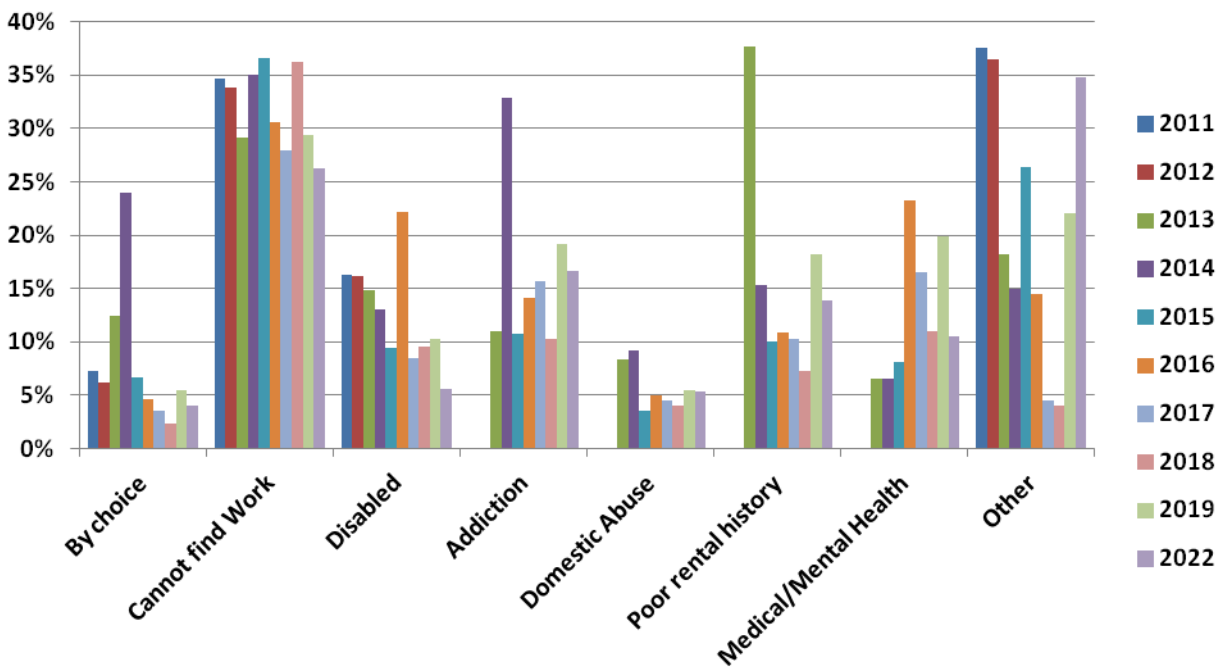

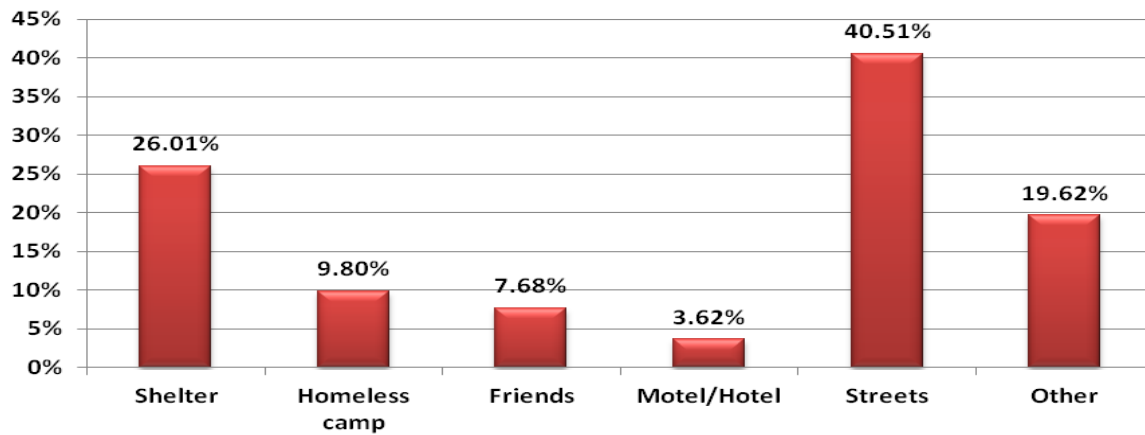
Length of Homelessness



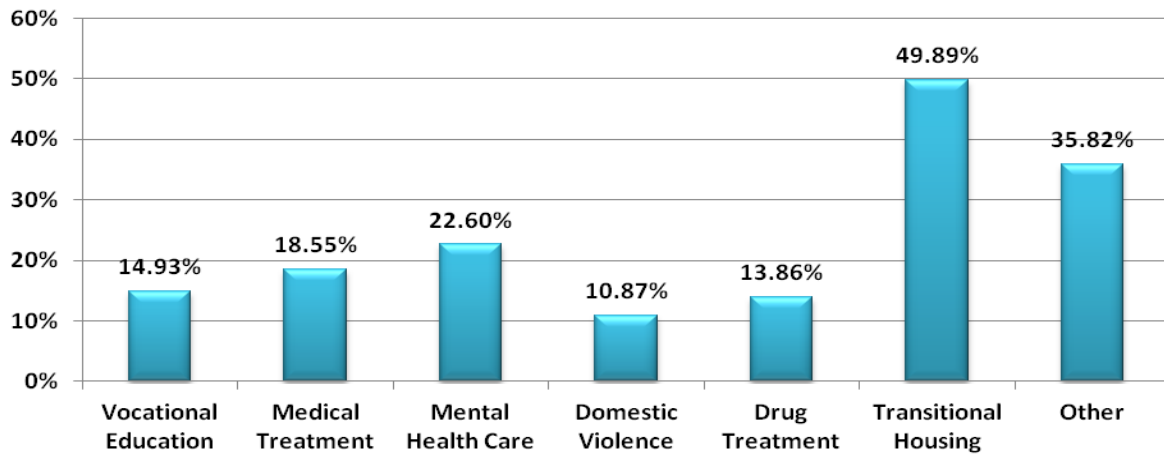
Reason for Homelessness
